With experience in all aspects of livestock production, including dairy, beef and lamb, pork, poultry and eggs, SGS is active in over 40 schemes directly related to livestock farming, covering full supply chains from farm to fork. GLOBALLY RECOGNIZED PROGRAMS

We offer a comprehensive range of recognized services that cover welfare schemes and farm assurance certification, including:

- Quality & Safety (QS), a German quality assurance scheme, benchmarked to GlobalG.A.P. and delivered throughout the world. It covers primary production from farm to fork, with a robust animal welfare component for livestock production
- Beter Leven from the Dutch Society for the Protection of Animals, which promotes higher welfare and organic production from farm to fork, covering multiple species across many EU countries
- Farm Sustainability Assessment (FSA) by the SAI platform, which monitors sustainable practices on farms, incorporating measurable outcomes that drive improvements in key areas

DAIRY

Forecast for significant growth, the dairy sector is one in which we have a particular specialism. Dairy products are an important nutrition source for feeding the world's increasing population. Focused on welfare, efficiency and environmental protection, we work with some of the largest dairy producers to verify practices on farms and the delivery of sector-specific assurance schemes. These include:

- Integrale Kwaliteitszorg Melk (IKM), a Belgian dairy quality assurance scheme, addressing welfare, food safety, traceability and quality
- QM-Milch (quality management milk), a German dairy assurance scheme that looks at regulatory compliance and good practice, with traceability and food safety elements. We offer QM-Milch, QM+ and QM++ schemes
- Pasture-fed dairy programs, including Pro Weideland and Stichting Weidegang in Germany and the Netherlands but also Leche Pastoreo in Spain, which verify scheme rules surrounding pasture time, stocking density and other welfare-related considerations

BEEF AND LAMB

Another key growth area, beef and lamb are an important source of protein, especially in middle- to low-income countries. We work with many global meat producers, monitoring food safety and animal welfare in meat production. With farm-to-fork capabilities, our core services include:

- North American Meat Institute (NAMI) Foundation inspections, monitoring meat production for regulatory compliance
- Uruguay Natural Meat Program, monitoring lifetime traceability, welfare and pasture-fed claims in the Uruguayan beef supply chain
- Codiplan PLUS/Belbeef standard, covering the Belgian beef supply chain, including breeders, feed suppliers, cattle transporters, abattoirs and cutting plants. It includes higher welfare standards and legal compliance
- Belgian-controlled Veal and KDK, which cover the veal industry in Belgium and Germany respectively, including inspection and sampling measures

In addition, we provide cattle performance monitoring and carcass classification for one million head of cattle each year.

PORK

One of the most consumed meats, pork is widely produced, especially in China, the Americas, Europe, Vietnam and the Philippines.

With the threats posed to the industry by African swine fever, we understand the sector's challenges and have services to address animal welfare, biosecurity, traceability and food safety. These include:

- BePork, a farm-to-fork quality standard in Belgium, covering production, including feed manufacturers, farmers, transporters, slaughterhouses, cutting plants and processors. This program focuses on animal welfare and health, and sustainability
- Kalayaan One Biosecurity
 Program developed by SGS in
 the Philippines, this program
 looks at animal health and welfare
 in conjunction with stringent
 biosecurity requirements. It
 helps farmers to recover and
 restart after disease outbreaks
 and to prevent disease ingress
 through animal health and
 environmental factors

POULTRY AND EGGS

Poultry is the fastest-growing area in the agricultural sector and is a vital part of the world's food supply. From capacity-building projects to verification and certification programs, our portfolio includes:
